

MAY

BOMA/GLA met with LA County Health Department about the emerging COVID-19 threat.

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**MARCH** 

BOMA California lobbied to ensure all rent owed is still legally due as cities passed eviction moratoria.

Learning of a potential local shut-down, BOMA/GLA initiated marathon meetings until minutes before local stay-at-home order was announced, ensuring building operations are deemed "essential" work.

LA Mayor Eric Garcetti announced formal "Safer at Home" program in response to Coronavirus epidemic.

Governor Newsom later issued first Stay at Home order.

BOMA/GLA Coronavirus Resource Center (CRC) launched.

As tenants prepared to return, BOMA/GLA pushed the City and County to release clear re-entry protocols and clarify tenant vs. landlord responsibilities to prevent the spread of COVID-19.

Over 30 blog posts written on updated rules, protocols, and re-opening checklists.

SB 939 introduced. BOMA/GLA immediately launched grassroots advocacy effort, leading to defeat of the bill.

BOMA/GLA Board of Directors began monthly meetings to address association needs during COVID-19 pandemic.

City of LA published "Resuming Operations Toolkit for Offices," including guidance that BOMA/GLA requested to clarify owners'/managers' responsibilities during COVID-19.

JUNE

Split Roll initiative officially listed as Proposition 15 on November 2020 ballot.

BOMA/GLA joined No on Prop. 15 coalition.

Began member awareness campaign and fundraising in coordination with No on Prop. 15 campaign and BOMA California.

AUGUST

BOMA on the Frontline blog launched

After weeks of meetings and testimony, BOMA/GLA successfully advocated against a rent freeze and classifying missed rent as consumer debt.

Mayor Garcetti requested input from BOMA/GLA on possible relief measures

BOMA/GLA formed COVID-19 Working Group met for first time to develop guides and resources.

BOMA/GLA joined BizFed COVID-19 Economic Recovery Task Force.

BOMA/GLA hosted COVID-19 Re-Entry webinars.

Online Learning Center launched.

Blog posts continued to address current events and member needs, including Civil Unrest preparedness.

JULY

SB 939 defeated.

LA City Council proposed vacancy tax. BOMA/GLA immediately engaged members to oppose. The proposal was dropped.

Board of Directors officially opposed Culver City Measure RE - a massive, ten-fold increase in the city's real estate transfer tax. BOMA/GLA immediately secured BizFed's opposition.

Virtual CRE Summit and Showcase is announced to take place on October28-29.
